





# ANGUS PLACE WEST PROJECT



## ABOUT THE PROJECT

Centennial Angus Place is seeking approval to recommence operations at the Angus Place Colliery, which has been in care and maintenance since 2015. Geological investigations indicate that there is approximately 8.5 million tonnes of coal reserves available for extraction within three mining domains.





## ANGUS PLACE WEST PROJECT KEY PROJECT ELEMENTS

The Angus Place West Project seeks to recommence mining operations and includes the expansion of mining into a new mining area. The project broadly includes:

- bord and pillar mining methods consisting of first workings only within the proposed mining area
- extraction of approximately 8.5 million tonnes of run-of-mine (ROM) coal at a maximum rate of up to 1.2 million tonnes each year until 2042
- the continued operation of the pit top, approved water management infrastructure and existing ancillary infrastructure
- coal handling and transfer to the Angus Place pit top, and underground to the Springvale Mine pit top
- construction and operation of a transfer pipeline between the pit top and Pumping Station Facility No.1 (to allow water to be transferred to the McPhillamy's Gold Project)
- transferring water to other Centennial Coal projects in the local area and to Mt Piper Power Station
- decommissioning and rehabilitation following the completion of mining activities.

A comparison between the operations at Angus Place Colliery approved under MP 06\_0021 and the project is provided in the table below.

## APPROVAL PATHWAY

The project is State significant development and requires development consent from the Minister for Planning and Public Spaces under the *Environmental Planning and Assessment Act 1979*.

The project would also require a controlled action approval under the Commonwealth *Environment Protection and Biodiversity Conservation Act 1999*.

### Benefits of the project

The project will provide:

- an ongoing supply of local coal to MPPS supporting energy security during the renewable energy transition
- employment opportunities for approximately 180 workers
- supply chain benefits with local contractors and contributions to the local, regional and State economies.



### Scoping Report

A Scoping Report has been submitted to the NSW Department of Planning, Housing and Infrastructure for the project. The Planning Secretary's Environmental Assessment Requirements will guide the studies required for the Environmental Impact Statement.
