

SSD-5145 Modification 4

Northern Coal Services Update

Centennial Northern Coal Services (**NCS**) operations include the surface Coal Preparation Plant (**CPP**) at the Newstan Colliery Surface Site (**NCSS**) and Cooranbong Entry Site (**CES**), as well as coal transfer via the private haul roads from CES to NCSS and Eraring Power Station.

NCS operates under State Significant Development (SSD) consent SSD-5145.

Centennial NCS is seeking to modify development consent SSD-5145 via Modification 4.

Modification 4 is on public exhibition from the 25th February 2025 to the 25th March 2025 and the Modification documentation can be accessed on the Major Planning Portal website via the following link: https://www.planningportal.nsw.gov.au/major-projects/projects/mod-4-cooranbong-coal-stockpile-extension

What is Proposed


Centennial NCS is seeking to modify SSD-5145, MOD 4, to allow for:

- Expansion of the existing coal stockpile at CES to increase capacity from 100,000 tonnes to approximately 400,000 tonnes;
- Construction of infrastructure associated with the modified stockpile footprint., including access tracks, site lighting, dust control infrastructure, fencing and water management controls; and
- An administrative update to the SSD-5145 Schedule of Land.

Project Justification

The proposed stockpile expansion Modification will provide NCS with greater flexibility in the management of Run of Mine coal received at the CES from the Mandalong Mine.

This will promote the continuous, reliable supply of coal from the NCS to meet customer demand and provide an ongoing economic benefit to NSW.

Environmental Impacts

The environmental studies completed for the Modification have determined that the identified impacts from construction and operation of the modified stockpile will generally be minor in nature and can be appropriately managed through the application of existing environmental controls and the implementation of additional mitigations at the CES.

The Modification Report includes the findings of technical and environmental investigations including the following:

- Noise:
